
New for July 2015! Student Summer Social Innovation Projects

Could your Social Enterprise offer a team of 3 students an opportunity to tackle an organizational challenge you are facing this summer?



Applications by 12th June 2015

With every challenge there is an opportunity to thrive.

This summer a group of colleagues across campus have pooled resources to test a brand new model for a volunteering project, supported by a student 'Volunteership Enterprise Award'. It's an opportunity to for students to explore opportunities to innovate and make a difference working with Lancaster's Social Enterprises.

What is it?

- Teams of 2 or 3 students will work on a challenge being faced by a Lancaster Social Enterprise to develop possible solutions to test or roll out as projects either during the pilot but more likely during the following academic year.
- The pilot will happen inside a period of 4 weeks from 6th July to 31 July 2015
- Students will volunteer to work on a challenge for 18 hours per week, and will receive a 'Volunteership Awards' package of accommodation, and a fixed expenses award for the duration of the pilot.

It's learning for everyone and an opportunity:

- For students to experience the social enterprise sector
- For the Social Enterprise to have a group of bright young minds working on an organisational challenge
- for team and group learning action research, creativity and designing and developing solutions to support innovation in social enterprises
- for us all to test the use of design and creative thinking tools
- for partners across Lancaster University to pool resources to test a new a model for developing student volunteering projects and future project leaders.
