
Mapping activity onto a time line **2E**

Mapping widening participation activity onto a time line can allow you to identify:

- The range of activities delivered throughout the year
- When resources (staff and space) are in high demand
- Connections and possible linkages between activities currently offered by different staff, services within the organisation
- Key events that might impact on implementing your evaluation plan
- When it would be practical to undertake evaluation data collection, analysis and dissemination
- For reporting or decision making purposes when committees meet or budget decisions made

Duration of Timeline

A timeline can cover a single year (see p2 of this document) which would allow you to map the institutional activities provided, or cover a number of years that would span the duration of a progression pathway (see p3 of this document) and a worked example in the presentation **2C**

Adding activities to the Timeline

A spreadsheet in Excel is useful for capturing background information or further information about activities on the timeline; it is also helpful in creating a flexible Gaunt Chart or table of activities or data collection. You can then extract relevant information to produce a table or diagram of key events in word or ppt format.


