

Improving access to Higher Education for disabled students





















Information for staff working in Sixth Form and Further Education Colleges

Recent research by Lancashire AimHigher Disability project has identified the following questions and sources of information that it may be useful to consider when thinking about how you support disabled learners who are studying for level 3 qualifications and / or show potential to study for a Higher Education (HE) qualification.

? Information. Advice and Guidance

- Are students aware of their HE options?
- Are students encouraged to visit HE institutions when making their UCAS choices?
- What help and guidance is available in your institution to assist students with UCAS application forms and Disabled Students' Allowance (DSA) forms?
- What advice do you provide for students about disclosing their disability? (e.g. Are students encouraged to disclose their disability and made aware of the potential benefits of disclosure?
- Is there an opportunity for students support needs to be assessed?
- Do you have access to sources of information about funding or support that might be useful for disabled students considering higher education?
- Do students know that you can study for a HE qualification at home, as well as some Further Education (FE) and HE Colleges and university?
- Are these pupils aware that the qualifications they study after their GCSEs will influence their access to HE even if they are not sure about studying in HE … we all change our minds and so it is better to leave doors open where possible?

? Summer Schools and HE Preparation

Disabled learners remain an under-represented group in HE. Summer schools provide an ideal opportunity for a young person to experience HE study. They give disabled learners the chance to find out about the support available and how this is funded and organised in HE. Summer schools are organised by Aimhigher and individual HE institutions.

- Do you and your students know about Summer Schools and HE Preparation programmes including those organised by Aimhigher?
- Are disabled students given information (e.g. publicity material and access to briefing sessions) about these taster experiences
- Is there support available to fill in application forms and discuss their concerns about summer schools?
- Do your students considering a Foundation Degree know that many courses have an induction programme preparation?
