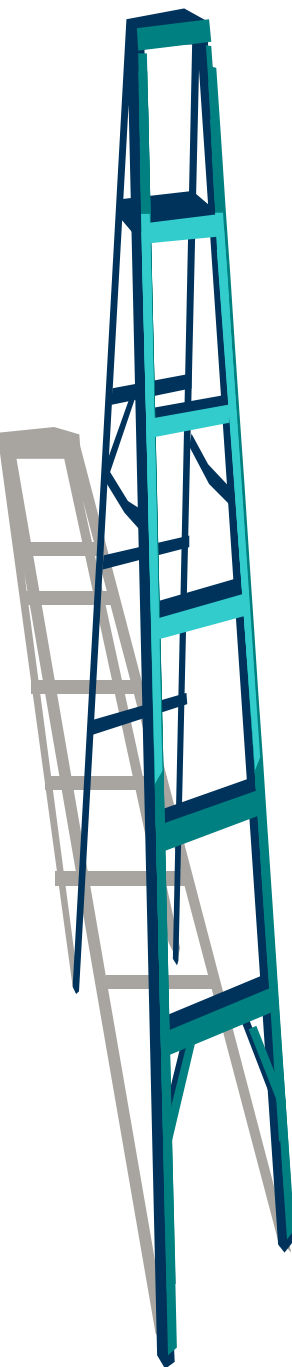

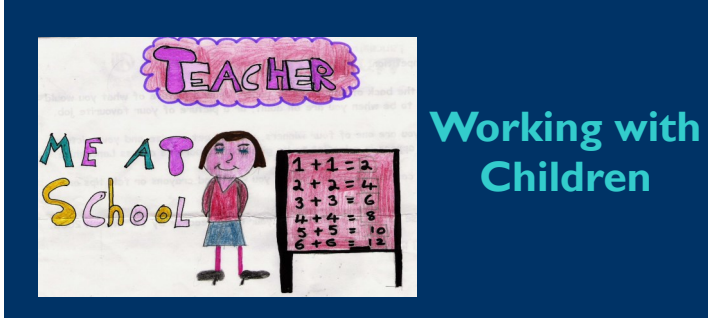

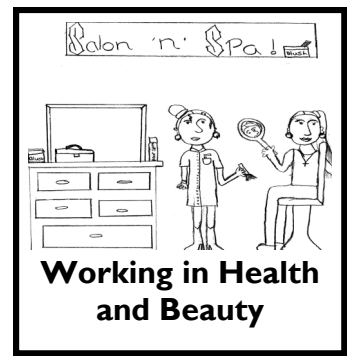

Make a decision to support your child's education move forward 1 space

Award Efforts:
Raise your child's motivation by taking an interest in their school and home life and by giving them praise when they do well.

Informal Visits:
Visit your local University or College on an Open Day with your child.

Increase child's motivation. Move forward 3 spaces

Encouragement:
Be positive and open about Further and Higher Education

Routine:
Encourage your child to have a routine to do their school homework and read.

Money Management:
Set up a savings account for your child and teach them how to manage pocket money.

Home Management:
Healthy eating, washing up, tidying the bedroom—these are all useful skills that will prepare for leaving home.
