Today, EDF Energy employs over 15,000 people across the UK - from Torness in Scotland right down to Exeter in Southern England. Heysham 2 is on the coast, 9 miles away from Lancaster University.

What are the placements about?

- Engineering (nuclear plant and/or conventional)
- IT (cyber security, networks)
- Environmental Science (radiological and/or conventional)
- Chemistry (organic, water or radiological gas chemistry)

Who can apply?

The placements are open to **environmental science**, **engineering**, **chemistry**, **computing** and **communications** students from all academic years and recent graduates. Students taking up the one year placements who are not recent graduates or final year students are encouraged to apply and if successful will be able to take a year out from their studies by intercalating.

Through the placement you will:

- Receive an equivalent full time salary of around £15,000
- Gain invaluable experience that complements your degree scheme
- Work within the energy sector, one of the most vibrant industries
- Spend time within different functions of the plant, as well as on project-based work within a specialist topic
- Work alongside experienced professionals highly regarded in their field
