

## Data set British National Corpus for essay question 10:

### be-passive vs get-passive

When answering this question please note the following:

- The examples below were taken from the BNC, a 100 million word corpus of written and spoken English, mainly but not only of British English
- In searching for examples only the past tense forms *was* and *got* of the passive auxiliaries were entered
- In order to limit the number of hits even more, only the 10 million word spoken subcorpus was used
- A few other restrictions were made to reduce the number of examples, but these should not have changed the kinds of examples found (e.g. the types of verbs that are passivised)
- As a final step to decrease the number of examples I've given you only about one third of all the instances of the *be*-passive. However, you *do* have all the cases of the *get* passive. Since there are now 100 examples of the *be*-passive vs. only 61 for *get*, you'd be right in concluding that the *be*-passive was by far the most frequent (more than 4 times as frequent as the *get*-passive).
- If you wish to investigate the linguistic context of (some of) the examples in more detail, then you should ask me how to get access to the BNC. The procedure is very simple; the reason I'm not giving the relevant information here is that access to the BNC is restricted to license holders, and the LING203 www page is publicly accessible.

- 22 H5D 577 But there is a major flaw that **was** pointed out when we had our last discussion about counting that alongside other factors, that you do a certain amount of work dependent on what your current staffing levels are.
- 23 HE5 106 He **was** caught in the act but got off with a caution.
