Traditional gender stereotypes challenge gender equality

A recently published report by the European Commission has highlighted the fact that traditional stereotypes continue to be the main challenge for gender equality in education. The report was based on data analysis carried out by the Eurydice network, which is The Eurydice Network which provides information on and analyses of European education systems and policies.

The report, entitled 'Gender Differences in Educational Outcomes: Study on the Measures Taken and the current situation in Europe' used data available from most of the EU member states (Bulgaria being the only member state not to participate), as well as Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway. It covers the organisation of schools, gender patterns in educational attainment, and gender equality policies in higher education.

Some of the key findings of the report are:

- Stereotypes concerning gender roles are the main challenge for gender-related educational attainment
- Gender-sensitive vocational guidance is focused on girls
- Policies on higher education focus mainly on increasing numbers of women in maths, science and technology (MST)

Research and Innovation

Commission's commitment to research and innovation

On a recent visit to Washington DC, Maire Geoghegan-Quinn, European Commissioner for Research, Innovation and Science outlined future priorities in EU policy for research and development (R&D). These priorities are linked to the new EU2020 economic strategy, particularly the pillars of 'smart growth' and 'inclusive growth', and include:

- The implementation of a new European Research and Innovation Strategy to be proposed to the European Council this autumn. This will revolve around the concept of an innovation-driven economy, or the 'i-economy'.
- Making vacancies in R&D more accessible throughout Europe
- Providing the required infrastructure for the knowledge-based economy, respectively access to high speed internet for all Europeans. This will be delivered via the Digital Single Market, which is addressed in the Commission's recent Digital Agenda strategy.

Commissioner Geoghegan-Quinn also took the opportunity to highlight R&D links between the EU and the US. The Science and Technology (S&T) Agreement between the EU and US was last year renewed until 2013 and is one of 19 such agreements with non-EU countries. The agreement covers reciprocal participation in programmes, exchange of researchers, the establishment of a joint research committee and the determining of rules specific to participation in research programmes and treatment of intellectual property rights in cooperative research activities. The US is the main partner outside of Europe in the EU's Seventh Framework Programme for R&D (FP7).

During her visit, the Commissioner held discussions with her US counterpart regarding the establishment of a transatlantic 'Innovation Partnership' aimed at addressing conditions needed to encourage the development and market take-up of innovative products, processes and services.

Virtual laboratory for infectious diseases

A virtual laboratory which helps match drugs to patients making treatments more effective will soon be available to doctors around the world in the fight against HIV and other infectious diseases.

The ViroLab Virtual Laboratory is based on the latest advances in machine learning, data mining, grid computing, modelling and simulation and turns the content of millions of scientific journal articles, different databases and patients' own medical histories into knowledge that can effectively be used to treat disease.

Developed by a multidisciplinary team of European researchers working in the EU-funded ViroLab project, the virtual laboratory is already being used in seven hospitals to provide personalised treatment to HIV patients. One of the projects' aims was to unlock the potential of personalised medicine by using a combination of technologies and methods to help doctors make decisions about the best medication to give each individual patient, accessed through a simple-to-use web interface.

The ViroLab Virtual Laboratory could be used to create personalised drug rankings to aid in the treatment of people suffering from other diseases. The ViroLab will look at drug dynamics in groups of

people infected with the H1N1 flu virus and co-infections, in addition to drug-resistant HIV.

ViroLab was funded under the ICT strand of the EU's Seventh Framework Programme for research. Partners in this project include the University of Amsterdam (the project coordinator), universities and research centres from Germany, Italy, Belgium, Spain, Hungary and the UK. Virtual partners in the project are represented by universities in Russia and Singapore.

Core components of the ViroLab Virtual Laboratory are scheduled to be available online in 2010.

New electric cars strategy

The European Council of industry ministers recently approved the European Commission's new strategy on 'clean and energy-efficient vehicles'. The strategy primarily addresses electric cars, including light-duty vehicles, and two- and three-wheelers, and sets out a medium- to long-term action plan. The need to address for heavy-duty vehicles and sustainable public transport in the near future was acknowledge by the Council.

The Strategy highlights the potential of (in the short and medium-term) electric and (in the medium-term) hydrogen vehicles as low-carbon alternatives to the combustion engine. In their conclusions, the ministers called upon the European Commission to:

- present guidelines on financial incentives to stimulate the market by encouraging consumers to purchase green vehicles, and continue to work on a European framework for green public procurement
- launch a thorough consultation process as a preliminary step to presenting legislative proposals on the regulation of the sector
- though EU standardisation bodies, produce harmonised solution to the interoperability of electric vehicles and recharging infrastructures (i.e. standardisation of plugs) by 2011
- collaborate with local authorities to accompany the market introduction of electric vehicles with awareness raising and mobility information tools and services
- to promote the development of fast- as well as slow-charging infrastructure

The Council welcomes the Commission intention to bring forward a legislative proposal on smart grids and to launch an EU-wide electro-mobility demonstration project in 2011.

The Commission is asked to report annually on the implementation of the strategy, as well as conducting a mandatory review to be performed in 2014. In relation to the strategy, a white paper on the de-carbonisation of transport and urban mobility is scheduled for publication in November 2010.

Consultation on ICT solutions in the care for elderly people

As part of an effort to respond to the challenges posed by the rapidly ageing population of Europe, the Ambient Assisted Living Joint Programme (AAL JP) has been set up as an applied research initiative which supports collaboration on projects enabled by Information and Communication Technology (ICT) in order to meet these challenges and exploit the opportunities. The AAL JP involves 23 European countries and the European Commission co-finances practical research aiming to deliver concrete solutions for independent living or 'ageing well' of elderly people using ICT, and runs from 2008 to 2013.

An interim evaluation of the Programme is currently taking part, for which feedback and views from all interested are required. The European Investment Bank - University Research Sponsorship Programme (EIBURS) has recently launched new calls for proposals on three topics.

EIB sponsorships can be up to €100,000 per year for a period of 3 years, and are awarded, through a competitive process, to interested university departments or research centres.

- The History of European Infrastructure Finance
- The Economic Impact of Law: An Economic Assessment of the Impact of the Packaging and Packaging Waste Directive

Alternative wind turbines

The NGO for Sustainable Regional Development and Environmental Protection from Varna, Bulgaria, is seeking partners for a project to be funded under the Seventh Framework Programme (FP7), entitled Advanced Vertical Axis Wind Electrical Generator (AVAWEG).

The aim of this project is to demonstrate that small- and medium-sized vertical-axis wind turbines could be more effective than the conventional ones.

The project is focused on creating an innovative construction of vertical axis wind turbines. Features of the developed wind turbines will include:

- At least 50% more efficiency than conventional 3 blades wind generators expected
- Inexpensive, light and compact turbines
- Potential for turbines to be mounted on roofs of buildings or offices

The success of the project could lead to the rapid implementation of this type of wind turbines for urban needs and the reduction of production cost below 0.04 EUR per kW/h, in line with EU directives.
