## The Painting of a Disabled Man – A Participatory Action Research Project

For more than 400 years the Painting of a Disabled Man has been part of the famous Chamber of Art and Curiosities at Ambras Castle near Innsbruck. It was the starting point of a major research project on the cultural representation of disability, financed by the Federal Ministry for Education, Science and Culture in Austria. The project was a cooperation of the Institute of Educational Sciences at the University of Innsbruck, the museum of Art-History in Vienna with its collection at Ambras Castle and the Center for Independent Living in Innsbruck.

In the course of the project two other historical paintings were found that are significant for the analysis of the cultural presentation of disability: a leaflet from 1620 showing Wolfgang Gschaidt, a carpenter with a disability, and a small picture from 1578, showing Elizabeth, a woman with a learning disability. The discussion and analysis of different gazes towards men and women with disabilities were at the center of attention.
