Dear Miss Kuhn,

I have to thank you for your letter of 22nd September in which you so kindly acknowledge my earlier letter of cinema-going recollections in the 30's. I am sure that you will have received many such letters more worthy of posterity than mine! How-ever, your kind remarks are appreciated.

I will make every attempt to attend the open work-shop on Thursday, Dec. 3rd., and of course you may contact me before this date for an interview, as you indicate in your letter: hopefully I can supplement my earlier recollections if you so wish.
