I think I owe you another apology, after writing my first letter, I had a telephone call, which I now think may have come from your office. I just heard television research, and as I had written about <u>films</u>, I thought it was another consumer research telephone call, and I had been inundated with research for "consumers" both at the door and on the telephone. So not realizing it was from your office, I was rather curt.

I now enclose one of your sheets completed to the best of my ability. My daughter had it
