CINEMA'S IT WAS A PIANIST + VIOLIN.  
THE SAD SCENSE LET THE VIOLIN  
GO TO TOWN, FOR THE CHASE HE  
HAD THE PIANIST RUNNING WILD  
ALONG THE KEYBOARD. JOKING ASIDE  
IT WORKED LIKE MAGIC.
