## Bolton Cinemas of the 1930s Audio Walking Tour

A walking tour around the sites of some of Bolton's most popular cinemas in the 1930s led by film historian Professor Annette Kuhn and featuring voices of cinemagoers of the period. The tour was recorded in August 2021.
