METT – MODERN LANGUAGE EXAMINATIONS TEACHER TRAINING (60 HOURS)

AIMS

- to develop teachers' awareness of good practice in modern European teaching, assessment and testing techniques,
- to raise teachers' awareness in terms of what skills can be tested and how they can be tested, and also how students can perform in the course of these tests
- to study and analyse the classroom implications and the washback effects of modern European English language examinations, and to experiment with implementing some of these implications in the classroom,
- to support teachers in their aim of raising standards of student performance both in the classrooms and in modern European language examinations.

The course aims to achieve this by:

- encouraging a spirit of observation, enquiry and discovery,
- presenting teachers with concrete information, such as sample tasks and sample tests,
- giving teachers opportunities to explore this information through practical interactive tasks and classroom research assignments,
- helping teachers to reach positive conclusions for teaching implications based on the information examined.
