The National Cyber Security Centre (NCSC) is inviting proposals for research into broad areas around safety and security, autonomous systems, incident response, cyber controls, interconnected systems and supply chain. Medical robotics challenge

The EPSRC UK-RAS Network has announced a new medical robotics challenge for contagious diseases, with a prize fund of £15,000. All applicants are asked to send a two-minute video demo of their entry by Wednesday 30th September. For more details, <u>see the UKRAS website</u>.



Still time to apply for Sony Research Award

The Sony Research Award Program is expanding to Europe in its fifth year. Universities can apply for funding to engage in cutting-edge research across three broad subject categories: information technology; devices and materials; and life sciences. Grants for national security research

The newly launched S-TRIG programme has opened calls for businesses and institutions to address future challenges within national security. Broad areas of interest include: aviation security; border security; detection of contraband entering prisons; protection of infrastructure; and counter-drones. <u>The deadline for</u> <u>applications is 20th September</u>.
