Scope and Content: Records of the Lancaster Art & Music Club, c.1945-1971. Mostly comprises correspondence and supporting papers covering the activities of the organisation collected by Michael Hansen, the Club's Honorary Secretary.

History: The Lancaster Art & Music Club was formed after a public meeting on 12th March 1945. The objective of the Club was to provide concerts, recitals, visits of touring drama companies and art exhibitions in Lancaster as a means of fostering an appreciation of music and arts in general. Initially the Club raised funds through membership subscriptions and was used to support its programme. The Club later began to receive grants from the Arts Council of Great Britain to support its aims. The Club was also affiliated with the National Federation of Music Societies. Over its history, the Club arranged 153 evenings of entertainment in the local region. In 1959, it revised its membership and began to include school memberships.

The Club decided to suspend its activities in the 1969-1970 season as it did not want to conflict with the first season of musical activities arranged by Lancaster University. The last public concert arranged by the Club was held at the University in 1971 featuring the Amadeus Quartet. At a meeting on 25 October 1971, the Club was wound up as it did not want to conflict with activities arranged by the University. The Club arranged one final event for their members at Duke's Theatre on the 15 May 1972 featuring Marisa Robels and Christopher Hyde-Smith.

The papers were collected by Michael Hansen, Honorary Secretary of the Club from 1951-1971. Hansen was also the Deputy Head at Lancaster Royal Grammar School. They were donated to the University by his widow in 1992.
