Campus tours



Seeing our beautiful campus in person is the best way to picture yourself studying here and find out what student life at Lancaster is really like.

Student led tours

Tours depart from Alexandra Square between 2pm-4:30pm and last approximately 45 minutes.

A current Lancaster student will show you around campus. You'll visit key locations such as the library, departmental buildings, social spaces, food and drink outlets and essential facilities. You'll also hear how your guide experiences campus as a current student and can ask any questions you may have about life at Lancaster.

Self-guided tours

The self-guided tour lasts around 45 minutes, but how long you take is up to you.

This is a great way to get to know the campus at your own pace, at any time throughout the day. You'll be guided to key locations, as you would on the student led tour, but we encourage you to also wander and explore as much as you like.

Accommodation tours



Visit the Student Experience Hub to speak to our friendly accommodation team and pick up a map of on campus residences that are open for viewing between 2pm and 4:30pm. At the accommodation blocks, student ambassadors will give you a guided tour and share their own experiences of living in university accommodation.

We have a range of accommodation options on campus (located within the colleges), including adapted rooms, to suit different needs, preferences and budgets.

Sports centre

We have a range of indoor and outdoor sports facilities, including a gym, climbing wall and swimming pool. There are also courts, pitches and multi-use game areas for both competitive and recreational sports.

Library

The library is open 24 hours a day during term time and offers a range of study spaces featuring living walls and plants, bookable pods for group work, and silent spaces for complete concentration.

Chaplaincy

Our multi-faith Chaplaincy Centre is open to people of all faiths and none. It provides religious, spiritual and pastoral support, as well as hosting a range of activities and events.

Cafes and shops

The campus is home to a variety of cafes, bars and restaurants serving delicious food and drink from around the world. We also have two supermarkets and a sustainable clothing shop.



The city *and beyond*

The city of Lancaster is just three miles north of the University. Its fascinating heritage and stunning architecture give student life an impressive setting.

You'll find shops, cafes, bars and restaurants to suit every vibe, plus arts and entertainment venues offering a varied calendar of cultural events.

Further afield, you can explore urban cities, expansive coastline and stunning countryside via Lancaster's excellent transport links. Lancaster is located between two National Parks: the Lake District and the Yorkshire Dales.

July to October
