Careers fairs

We can visit you! If you organise an annual higher education event or run a series of university progression activities and would like a representative from Lancaster to support them, please do get in touch.

Drop-in sessions and personal statements

During the academic year, we can visit your school or college to deliver an informal talk - perhaps during a lunch break or tutor group session - to any of your students who may be interested in studying at Lancaster. We can also provide students with personalised support and advice when drafting their personal statements

Teacher meetings and CPD

We provide a range of CPD sessions for school and college staff working with post-16 students on areas such as references, personal statement support, UCAS, student finance or updates within the HE sector.

Talks and presentations

We offer a wide variety of sessions and presentations for students. A selection are detailed on pages 5 - 7 and many can be tailored to your needs. Choosing a Course and University (Presentation or Workshop) Choosing where to go and what to study is an important decision for students. We'll help them understand how to research and explore their options, what key factors to consider during the decision making process, and ultimately how to have confidence in identifying what's right for them.	2, 3, 5, 7

Personal Statement Writing (Presentation or Workshop) In this workshop we'll advise how to develop a personal statement for competitive universities. We discuss how to create the ideal personal statement, looking at real examples and examining how to collate and structure ideas.	3, 5, 7

Students will explore what makes Lancaster University a unique and vibrant place to spend the next few years of their lives. From our collegiate system and student life (including access to over 175 different sports and societies) to our prestigious, highly-ranked degree programmes and thousand-year-old city, we give more than just an insight into the true Lancastrian experience.	
Applying to Competitive Universities (Presentation)	2, 3, 4, 7
We cover what makes certain universities and courses competitive and share our top tips for making an application stand out from the crowd. With insights from our admissions team, we'll guide students through the UCAS process and highlight the key aspects of an application that we're looking for.	
Student Finance and Budgeting (Presentation or Workshop)	2, 3, 5, 7
We look at what financial support is available, alongside how to apply for student finance and repayments. We also offer advice on budgeting and encourage students to consider money-saving techniques whilst at university.	
Making the Most of University Life (Presentation)	3, 5, 7
Through feedback from our students, alongside key hints and tips, this session gives your students an idea of what to expect in the first weeks and how to make the most of societies and sports, careers support, study abroad opportunities and work placement years. We also highlight key tips for staying well, budgeting and living independently.

Students will learn about different interview types for university and employment and what both will be looking for. We also offer practical advice for attending in-person and virtual interviews.

If your students are worried about standing out in the graduate job market, they aren't alone. We'll discuss both virtual and physical activities to help them build a CV of which they can be proud.

Our experienced admissions and recruitment staff can offer a variety of presentations as part of your visit, including personal statements, choosing a course and university, enhancing employability and many more!


Student Q&A panels

Widening Participation

We support schools, colleges, teachers and students to ensure that higher education is an open and inclusive environment, representative of the society we live in. Alongside a contextual admissions process to help us to improve social mobility and widen access for all, we have a programme of award-winning outreach projects and activities.

Lancaster Success Programme (LSP)

A welcoming and inclusive environment where students are empowered to define their own versions of success, The Lancaster Success Programme is designed to support students through their university journey and beyond. Students who have taken part in the Lancaster Access Programme or have received a contextual offer will be invited to join. With a dedicated Success Coach, students on the LSP will attend regular 1:1s and be invited to group activities such as Action Learning Sets, Peer Support, and termly social events planned and delivered by a team of Student Advocates.

Lancaster Access Programme

This is an exciting opportunity for your students in Years 12 and 13 to engage in a range of events and activities with a clear progression pathway to Lancaster University. Students will take part in activities ranging from workshops, online sessions, residentials and themed campus sessions. Upon completion of the programme, students will receive a contextually-lowered offer of up to three A-Level grades or equivalent, and be eligible for the Lancaster Opportunity Scholarship. Utilising our dedicated online portal, students can access specific resources and receive personalised contact with Lancaster staff and current students to support their progression to university: www.lancaster.ac.uk/lap.

Contextual offers

Our contextual offer scheme aims to identify the potential of applicants whose personal circumstances may have impacted their achievement in education.

Students who are applying to start a degree at Lancaster University could be eligible to receive a contextual offer instead of our typical offer. A contextual offer will be lower than the typical offer, as shown on our website pages and in our prospectus. No additional application process is required - once we receive applications through UCAS, we automatically make an adjusted offer to all qualifying students.
