Lancaster University Finances – Happy 2024 for the VC whose salary has gone up 6.7%

As usual, financial statements were released just before the holidays so you might have missed some key information when the VC starts 2024 off, pleading institutional poverty and calls for cuts:

- 1. Staff Costs as % Income have improved just marginally despite all the talk of 'investing' in staff and 'highest FTEs ever', from 50% to 50.5%. Overall, the university has a target of 52%, but we think sector average is >55%, so judge for yourself.
- 2. The University has lost £.75M in UA92, but it did better than the £2M it lost last year.
- 3. Overall, the University still has a surplus, despite whatever they might say about 'challenging times' 'dire finances' of around **£36M.**
- 4. The University also holds cash (called unrestricted reserves, i.e. cash held in banks) of around **£52M**.
- 5. The number of people who earn above £100k has gone up to 91 from 71 (52 in 2018). This is a huge increase in 'senior' managers being employed to manage us, although this would include a small number of professors who have negotiated (or have been recruited) off the professorial bands.
- 6. Finally, the icing on the cake: The VC's salary has gone up by 6.7% (double the 3% we were given), from £285k to £304k. Just his USS pension contributions, paid by the University, are approx. 1.5 times a G8 salary. Happy new year for the VC for sure, after all, he deserves for the sector-leading way he handled the cost of living crisis for staff and MAB!

Grievances about Grievances

Co-presidents, Nils and Julie, and Unite and Unison met last week with POE to urgently find solutions to the ongoing problems with the grievance process. Solutions were identified around case management, here's to implementation.

Piloting Simitive Workload Models

After some prompting, unions were finally provided last week with a presentation by the Deputy VC and Director of Finance on the new system being piloted. Given the range of hours allocated to different tasks, principles will be communicated and a practical demo of the system will be given to. Unions' concerns about privacy, abuse by head of departments (hod selection process raised), separation from the PDR process were all raised by the unions.
